



The Conditional Cash Payments program is a scholarship scheme with a difference. We enable school communities to identify families that require support in getting their children to school. Based on a commitment to improve attendance, the school provides those families with small cash payments, or bicycles, to allow their children access to an education.

Often children in Cambodia miss school because their families do not prioritise education. The reality for many families is that they are more focused on working to survive; they live too far from the nearest school; or they do not recognise the importance of sending their children to school.

CCP exists as one of a suite of integrated programs designed to improve access to quality education in rural Cambodian communities. Our school community partnerships identify why attendance rates are low and drop out rates are high. This program is designed to address some of the barriers that prevent children from getting to school.

The local committee manages and evaluates the effectiveness of the process and how it contributes towards regular school attendance

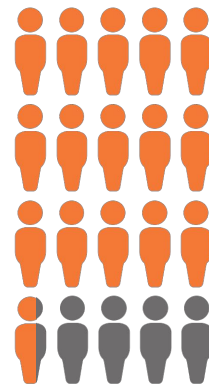
Our Impact: 2015

In 2015, SeeBeyondBorders has already supported 180 children in seven schools across Bavel, Ek Phnom and Angkor Thom districts with the CCP program. The average rate of attendance of the children from targeted families was 79% in January 2015. By July, that attendance rate had improved dramatically to 97%.

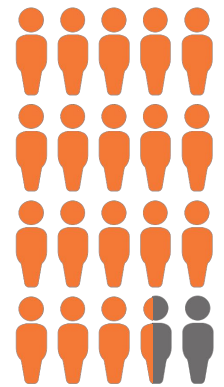
